The foundation qualification is on the Irish NFQ at level 5 (equivalent to UK level 3). The NFQ level 5 qualification means students who complete the programme can apply to any Irish university QQI approved – validates quals such as bachelor's degrees, PG, dips and certs. .





Why Foundation?

Designed for international students





Ireland Visa Process

- **Apply online:** Takes 6-10 weeks
- **Documents:** Transcripts (English), explain education gaps, past visa info (if any)
- **Finances:** Bank statements (latest 6 months), enough funds for tuition + €10,000/year living expenses (foundation & next 3-4 years). Show proof of access to €10,000 for following years (doesn't need to be in bank yet).
